Autumn has arrived, and our volunteers have been as busy as ever. Here's the latest from your community project — The Old Police Station and our growing Garden@91.

GARDEN@91 - A GROWING SUCCESS!

The garden has been our main focus this year — and what a transformation it's been! IJT completed the hard landscaping in April, and since then our brilliant volunteers have rebuilt the dry-stone wall (hedgehog hole included!), added fencing and gates, and tackled mowing and weeding with enthusiasm. Recent work includes planting an evergreen framework and spring bulbs to give year-round colour, with more planting and a nature area (complete with bug hotels) planned for spring. We've also named the space — Garden@91 — and we hope you like it!







Though not yet finished, it's already lovely to see people using it as a peaceful walkway and a quiet spot for Wild Fig customers. In time, Garden@91 will host small community events and offer a welcoming place to meet friends.

FUNDING THE FUTURE

Generous grant support has made this work possible. The National Lottery recently awarded us £5,460 for garden costs and volunteer tools — adding to the £30,500 already received from other funders.

Thanks to a £750 grant from the Royal Wootton Bassett and Cricklade Area Board, the front of the building now has smart new paving — improving both safety and appearance. With more visitors expected as the garden develops, the timing couldn't be better.

QUEEN ELIZABETH II WALKWAY & HERITAGE DISPLAYS



Earlier this year, we unveiled the Queen Elizabeth II Walkway to mark the late Queen's reign and Cricklade's heritage. It now sits alongside a new display celebrating High Street businesses from years gone by.

We also welcomed a new addition — the mosaic bee, once part of the Jubilee mosaic at Saxon's Rest. It now sits proudly beside the walkway. (Many thanks to our generous donor — you know who you are!)

New flooring was also installed, largely funded by a grant from Waylands Estates Charity, and a community noticeboard opposite the mosaic bee now highlights local events and announcements.

MEMBERSHIP & SHAREHOLDINGS - YOU MIGHT WANT TO TOP UP!

Thank you to all members who continue to invest in the Foundation. Last year, we paid 2% interest on shareholdings of £2,500 and above. From 1 October 2025, this rises to 3%, reflecting both market conditions and the near completion of the Old Police Station redevelopment.

If your shareholding is below £2,500, consider topping up to benefit. And remember — with a valid nomination, the first £5,000 of your shareholding can fall outside your estate for inheritance tax purposes.
